I feel that this fundraiser needs to be looked at further to see if it is possible to make it more profitable. Our sales have gone down each year. Suggestions include lowering the price of the tickets and/or adding a second and third prize.

I am really finding it very difficult to leave work during April to work on the fish fries and Saturday evening masses. If we continue to sell during April, I need someone else to take over responsibility for Friday and Saturday evening sales. I could still be responsible for the Sunday 9 a.m. mass sales.

New Business:

Environmental Concerns -Patsy Meyer made a presentation to the Parish Council representing the Environmental Concerns Committee that she leads and has led for the last 3 years. Patsy's committee has shared the Pope's prayers and writings on the Environment. The committee has discussed the parish's use of styrofoam. Patsy has shared that Styrofoam doesn't biodegrade and the committee would like for the parish to adopt ban on its use on campus. Patsy will research the cost comparison between biodegradable products and styrofoam starting with the fish fry's in lent.

KIDS Café - For the 2023 -2024 school year. There were 51 children who participated, however 11 dropped out primarily due to transportation issues. The students came from 2 Catholic schools & 4 public schools, including one charter school in Sellersburg, Indiana. About 80 adult & youth volunteers participated from neighboring parishes, the nearby neighborhood and the local Catholic and public high schools.
