  - i. Fencing has been installed
  - ii. Financial reports for January 2025 have been completed
     Tithing pledge campaign has been started for 2025 and were mailed out
     (450 were sent). There is an issue with registration dates for 200+ families
  - iii. 2024 Contribution Statements were sent to parishioners
  - iv. Update on the relocation of dumpster and recycle
     Having to redo the sewage behind the Community Center and the PLC at a cost around \$30k to rerun the water line will hit \$50k
     Trash will get a fence around it and the Recycle may move near the Community Center
  - v. Installation of church door hardware has begun
    Will Klien hardware is taking a long time, electrical work is planned for this
    Friday. OCI will then have to install the locks and cameras, but it is separate
    from the rest of the parish campus. Father will follow up with Dave on
    possible other options

- vi. Bell tower installation
  - Carillon speaker that will chime on the hour and toll during a funeral OCI is supposed to run this wire
- vii. Painting of the cross (gold) On Frank's list of St Joseph's projects
- viii. Fan and switch installation for incense Has been installed and Father has learned the amount to add. Non-smoking hypo-allergenic. This is programmed to run most every day. No switch only on timer, on during the masses.
